

SEARCH FOR FLOWERS


The best place to continue your plant learning is in your own neighborhood, in places such as:

- Nearby woods
- Along paths and roadsides
- Vacant lots
- Schoolyards
- Fields
- NY State Parks

USE THE COLOR GUIDE IN YOUR BOOK

Identifying a plant is a great first step to learning about the green world around you. Your new book is arranged by flower color to help you do this.

- As you flip through the book, look for the flower colors indicated on upper right hand corner of the page.




- Bring this book outside with you and turn to the section that matches your flower's petal color.
- Look through the pictures in that section for a match to your flower.
- If you think you have a match, read the description to help verify that you have the correctly identified your plant.

KEEP A WILDFLOWER JOURNAL

Build your flower knowledge and fascination!

You can write down:

- The date you found the plant
- The plant's location
- A description of the plant's size, colors, leaves, and flowers
- Observations of the plant at different times of the day
- Observations of the plant at different times during the growing season
- Try drawing the plant's parts
